Gilberdyke Bridge Replacement

Dear Neighbour,

We are currently in the planning stages for the replacement of the HUL1/29 bridge on Staddlethorpe Broad Lane.

As part of the work we need to close the road over the bridge and implement a diversionary route. The diversionary route will be in place from 10/04/20 to 01/05/20 and affect access to Yokefleet, Blacktoft and the surrounding area. Residents will also notice an increase in traffic in the area while the diversionary route is in place. The diversion route has been agreed by the local highway authority and signs will be in place.

Prior to main road closure, works are required on the route to ensure it is suitable for all vehicles. There will be some vegetation management to be completed to allow clear access along the route, this will involve cutting back overhanging vegetation.

There is also a requirement to extend the culvert near the Greenoak Goit level crossing to widen the carriageway. The road widening works will require a road closure at the junction, with traffic diverted to Staddlethorpe Broad Lane. Access to the adjacent properties will be maintained during the works. These works will be undertaken during the day towards the end of February into March.

The equipment our engineers use means that some disturbance is unavoidable, but we make every effort to minimise noise and disruption. All our staff on site are briefed to keep noise on site to a minimum and to respect the local community.

We will be holding two information events to enable the local community to come along and find out more about this work.
